Foreign beers:

Welcome to the Twickenham Foreign Beer Bar!

This year we have scoured the known universe to bring you an even wider selection of delights, including for the first time some draught beer: Thursday pm Schelde Zeezuiper (an 8.5% Dutch spiced golden ale); Friday pm Graal Blond (a dry-hopped 6.5% Belgian ale); Saturday Abbaye des Rocs (a big ruddy brown 9% Belgian ale with liquorice).

A feature this year is a range of unusual strong, dark beers, including Flying Dog Gonzo Porter (USA), Witnica Porter (Poland), Klein Duimpje Imperial Russian Stout and Erik de Noorman Barley Wine (Netherlands) plus perennial favourite Ellezelloise Hercule Stout from Belgium.

You will not find here syrupy alcopops masquerading as fruit beers – such concoctions have no place on a CAMRA bar! Instead, we offer such delights as: De Cam Oude Kriek (cherries macerated by the first new lambic blender in decades); Drie Fontein Schaarbeek Kriek using especially rare bitter schaarbeek cherries – is there a better kriek? Not IMHO!!!

Also, Schelde Schoenlappertje using blackcurrants from a neighbouring farm.

Finally, to highlight the great Franconian beers from Mahrs Undespundet and Hummel Wheat Beer and their Rauch (smoke) beer!

There is indeed something here for all discerning palates. *Cheers! Jon Russell Brown*
